1. Complete Application, CAPF 12. Fees are around \$65 a year - See PDO or Commander for Form
2. Obtain two copies of fingerprints from in-house Finger Printer or outside service. We have the fingerprint cards available.
3. After 4 Meetings, Submit application and fingerprint cards to Squadron Commander – One on One interview, After successful completion, you may mail application, fingerprints and check or money order to HQ. This is how you become an official member.

 - d. Review Cadet Protection Slides
 - e. Take eServices test and pass, meet with Squadron Commander or PDO to discuss/correct score to 100% using references above
 - f. Review two scenarios with Squadron Commander or PDO

11. Complete the Foundations Modules Level 1 Training - eServices login required

General Qualification Requirements

- Be a current, active CAP member at least 17 years of age (16 years of age for CAP glider pilots).
- Possess a valid FAA private, commercial, or airline transport pilot certificate.
- Possess a valid FAA Class III or higher medical certificate (not required for gliders).
- Possess a current flight review IAW FAR 61.56
- Satisfactorily complete a CAPF5 flight check in an aircraft (in an appropriate group) within the preceding 12 months, or if initial flight check complete one hour flight in appropriate aircraft with CAP instructor within the preceding thirty days.
- Complete an annual CAPF5 written examination and annual aircraft questionnaires for each aircraft authorized to fly.



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
